Elm, ash, cedar, fir, spruce, or basswood were the usual sources of bark.

In building the longhouse, a row of forked poles was placed in the ground, between four and five feet apart. ① Cross poles were lashed to the forked uprights to form an arched roof. Slender poles or rafters were then secured to the roof frame, and traverse poles were added to further strengthen the overhead structure. ② Large pieces of bark were then tied to the frame. The bark was obtained in the spring, by stripping the trees when the sap began to flow. ③ An outer set of poles kept the bark in place on the sides and roof. Smoke holes were built into the roof at about twenty-foot intervals. ④ These were usually covered with a piece of bark. ⑤ The hearth beneath the smoke hole was shared by two families.
